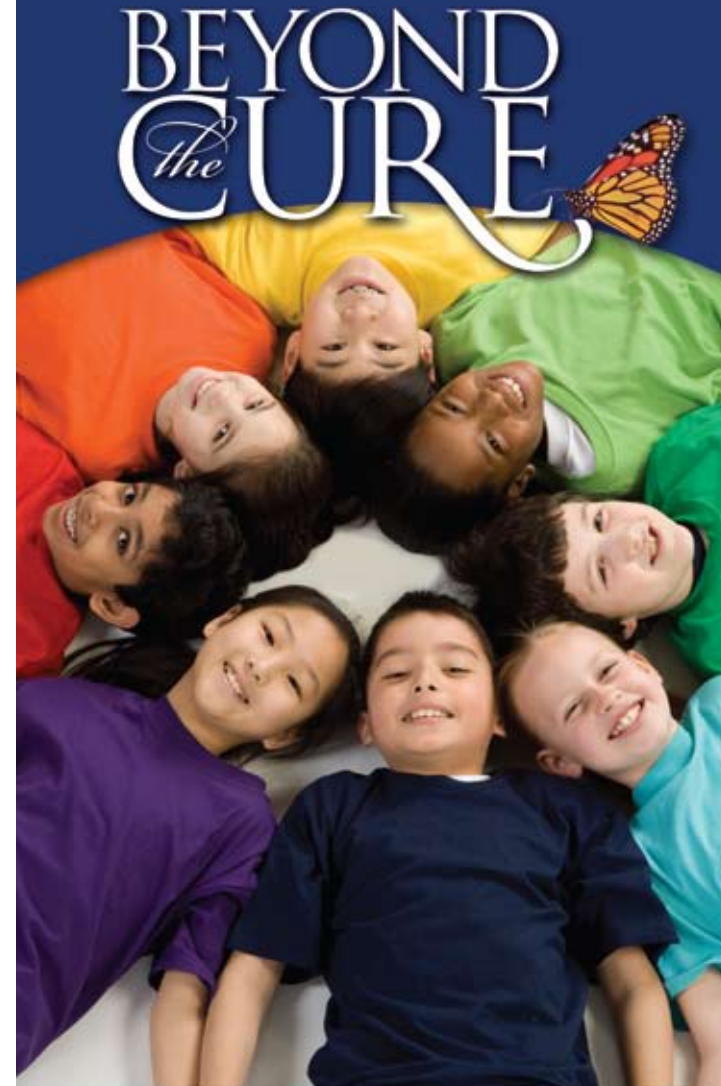

## Teleconference Series

### Purpose

Survivor probably has its own unique meaning for you. Since the day the doctor said the word "cancer", you and your family have become survivors. Despite the fact that medical advances have drastically increased survival rates, cancer and the treatment may have affected you in ways that may or may not be physically visible. This can influence your future medical health, finances, emotional well being and even your education or vocational choices. This series of teleconferences will address some of these concerns as they occur during treatment and after treatment has ended. Health care providers must be aware of the unique needs of these individuals. They should be educated early and often, through diagnosis and treatment, in the months that follow and in the long-term follow-up clinics. Surviving cancer is a life-long commitment.

The National Children's Cancer Society has designed these teleconferences for childhood cancer survivors, parents or guardians, social workers, nurses and anyone involved in the care of children with cancer.
